Dear Secretary Salazar,

We are writing to urge you to approve the Cape Wind project. Based on independent opinion polls, 86% of Massachusetts citizens and specifically the majority of Cape Cod, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket citizens support the Cape Wind project on Horseshoe Shoals in Nantucket Sound. Once built the project will supply, on average, 75% of the regions electrical needs and represents the largest single supply side reduction in greenhouse gases ever proposed in the United States.

Cape Wind will concretely advance President Obama's stated objectives in addressing the challenges of climate change while promoting energy security and economic development. Following this lengthy and rigorous review, approval of Cape Wind will also send a critical message that this country is serious about shifting our energy production away from using fossil fuels and will help lay the strongest possible foundation for offshore wind energy development in the United States.

We appreciate your efforts and welcome your direct involvement to avoid further delay for a final decision by setting a deadline of March 1, 2010 to conclude the consultation under the National Historic Preservation Act. Our hope is that a positive Record of Decision will be issued by you soon after the deadline because as you said, "the public, the parties and the permit applicants deserve certainty and resolution."

We the undersigned supporters urge you to issue a positive Record of Decision for Cape Wind.
